Featured Athlete



Elsie Wilson

Elsie Wilson is not only an LSOG Member, but the #1 ranked female Badminton player in the 65-69 age group in the USA. Mrs. Wilson says, "Badminton is an exhilarating sport. I highly recommend it because the rules are easy to learn, it's good exercise and you can start at your own pace."

Badminton has a long history tracing its roots back to ancient Greece, China, and India. Modern Badminton was brought to England in the 1860's by English soldiers stationed in India. The English "fell into the swing of things" and before long had standardized the sport. Today, Badminton is the world's fastest growing racket sport. Right here at home in Louisiana, Badminton is played across the state at Senior Olympic District Games and at the State Championships in the fall.

Wilson began playing Badminton at the age of 19 while attending college. A natural at the game, she began winning international tournaments. After ten years of fierce competition, she married and moved to Corpus Christi, TX where she and her husband raised two children. Mrs. Wilson, unable to find Badminton competitions in Corpus Christi began marathon running to stay physically active. After 30 years in Texas, she and her husband moved to Baton Rouge. That was eight years ago and she has been playing Badminton ever since. She joined LSOG in 1999 and plays weekly with other LSOG members at Baton Rouge Recreation Center's Alaska Street Park.

Mrs. Wilson is back to competing in National and International Games. Every year she participates in the US Nationals

and consistently earns the #1 ranking. This past March she walked away with 2 Golds and 2 Silvers. She is also a member of *The Lady Patriots* badminton team, which also includes LSOG member Sandra Matthieu. *The Lady Patriots* were selected to represent the USA at the 1999 Osaka Japan's Annual Ladies Friendship Badminton Tournament. *The Lady Patriots* plan to attend this tournament again in the fall. Mrs. Wilson is also a competitor in the World Master's Games held every 4 years. These games allow athletes to compete in all sports and usually bring in 30,000 athletes from around the world.

Badminton is a great way to stay physically active and have fun. Elsie Wilson states that "Badminton helps with her flexibility and agility." The LSOG would love to see new Badminton participants at the State Championship Games this fall!

Trivia:

Badminton received its name from the Duke of Beaufort's estate named "Badminton".
